Washougal School District Pathways Program (Draft Proposal)

Comments: What are we seeking to do?

We are seeking to create a partnership with East County Fire and Rescue to secure their vacant facility, located in Washougal at 39th St. and Evergreen Way, while also providing a quality program for Washougal School District adult students with disabilities.

Who are the students?

It is our responsibility as a school district to educate students with disabilities until they are 21 years of age. Washougal School District has approximately 12 students who are ages 18-21 suffer from moderate to severe disabilities. Disabilities these students have include developmental/cognitive delays, severe learning disabilities, significant communication deficits, and some also have corresponding physical disabilities. These students have all completed the credit requirements to graduate from High School as indicated in their Individualized Education Plan (IEP), but because of their disability and the goals in their Independent Transition Plan (ITP) portion of their IEP they are not ready to receive their diploma and transition to post secondary life.

How do we serve these students?

The program for these students is not a traditional academic program, but instead focus on their ITP within their IEP. The three main areas on their ITP include education/training, employment, and independent living. Currently, this program operates out of a classroom at the high school. This poses a challenge because they are not around students who are their peers (in age) and they are limited in the facilities that are available in the school. This group works skills involving public transportation, pre-employment training and apprenticeships, cooking, cleaning, etc.

Currently they are volunteering at several businesses and agencies in the community, including (but not limited to):

- Miss Jaimie's Daycare
- Dairy Queen

- Burgerville
- Camas Power Equipment
- Walgreen's
- West Columbia Gorge Humane Society
- Children's Home Society: bag food and then deliver to Hathaway for their backpack weekend food program
- Columbia Ridge Retirement Center: moving furniture, cleaning, lots of painting, maintenance work, yard work
- WHS kitchen: dishes, mopping
- WHS custodian: help put away tables after lunch
- Hathaway Kitchen: dishes
- JMS Art room: recycle clay, hang up art work

We teach them skills to be a contributing member of society who can function as independently as possible.

How will this facility meet our needs?

First of all, it separates them from the high school where they have already spent four years and completed the high school class credit requirement to graduate as indicated in their IEP. This new location will encourage more students to complete the transition portion of their IEP just based on that fact alone.

The first floor includes:

- A classroom that can be used for whole group instruction for their education/training and to provide pre-teaching for their employment goals; and
- Two office spaces that can serve the teacher but also for teaching basic filing, organizing, and desk-clerk skills.

The large garage:

- Can be used for a variety of production tasks or how to check the oil in the van for the program; and
- o It also has hookups for a washer and dryer that can be used to support students learning how to do laundry (sorting, washing, drying, folding, and putting away).

The second floor includes a living quarters that resembles a house or apartment and would provide a perfect opportunity to further their independent living skills. They would be able to learn how to:

- Plan a meal, budget that meal, shop for the meal, cook the meal, and clean up from the meal;
- Appropriately set a table and serve food to others;

- Clean and maintain a full bathroom appropriately;
- o Hang clothes, fold and put clothes away;
- Make a bed in the bedroom spaces; and
- Dust and vacuum and clean spots on a couch.

In the outside areas, they could learn how to:

- Pressure wash moss off the side of the building;
- o Paint an exterior section; and
- How to keep the parking lot/driveway clear of debris.

Lastly, it is closer to town and public transportation than the high school, which is important for the students to have the ability and time to be in the community to complete tasks within their IEP.

When would we be in operation?

We run this program the length of the school year (roughly September through June). Students would be in the building any given time during the typical school day (roughly 8:00-2:30, M-F) when they aren't out in the community learning environment.

How will we staff the program?

The program would be staffed with a full time teacher and educational technician (current staffing) and additional para-educators as necessary depending on student number and need.
