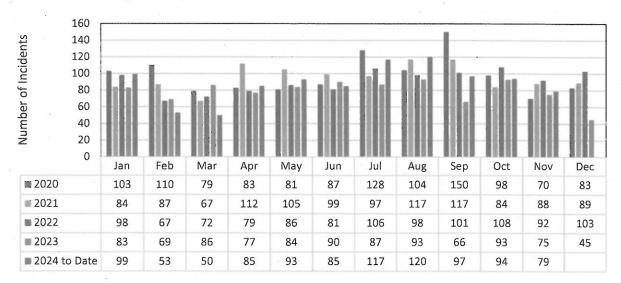
Response Activity

Staffing and Deployment

During the month of November, the district maintained a 90th percentile¹ shift staffing level of 4.00 personnel during the day (07:00-19:00) and 4.00 personnel at night (19:00-07:00). Station 94 was unstaffed once during the day, once at night, and once for a full shift (07:00-07:00) and as such, the availability of response from this station was 93.33%.

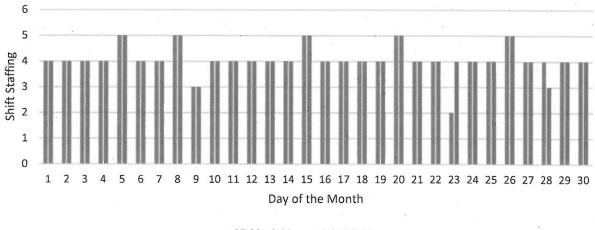


Figure 2. Daily Shift Staffing



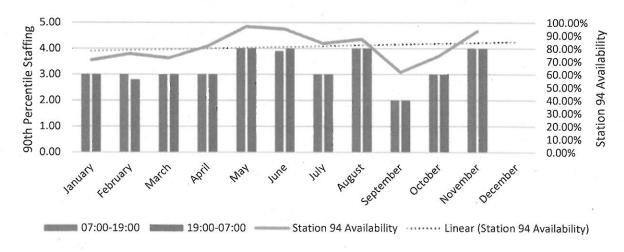


Figure 3. 90th Percentile Shift Staffing and Station 94/93² Availability for Response

Daily shift staffing is illustrated in Figure 2 and Figure 3 illustrates 90th percentile staffing and availability from Station 94.

In addition to full- and part-time staffing, the district's volunteer members worked eight shifts during the day and one shift during the night for a total of 108 hours of service to the community. Several of our volunteer members are currently certified as EMTs, as firefighters, or both. Others are at the start of their training. However, all our volunteer members provide a valuable service and contribute to the great work being done by staff on shift.

Shift Reports

A Shift/Training: Training this month included EMS ongoing training and evaluation focused on infectious disease control. Fire training addressed conventional forcible entry, water supply, fire suppression systems, and strip mall fire simulations. In addition, members completed four tactical decision simulations for the initial incident commander and one for the first arriving command officer. Volunteer firefighter 2023 and 2024 cohorts worked fire control and forcible entry.

Captain Sorensen completed training for qualification as a hazmat incident commander delivered by the Washington State Patrol.

B Shift/Facilities and Community Risk Reduction: This month Captain Sorensen worked on reducing the potential for frozen pipes at Station 94 (isolation valves for exterior piping) and developed a plan to reduce the slip hazard presented by the polished concrete floor in the apparatus room.

C Shift/Apparatus and Equipment: The district received notice from CRESA that most of the district's 800 MHz radios have reached their end of support (unable to be fixed if broken) and the remaining 800 MHz radios will be in the same status in 2025. CRESA has obtained a bid for joint purchase of replacement of radios purchased in 2014 (county wide). This necessitates revision of the district's capital projects schedule to allow radios to be ordered this month for 2025 delivery. Revision to the capital projects schedule also is necessary to reflect the timing of progress and final payments for the engine to replace Engine 94 and the anticipated purchase of a water tender to replace Water Tender 93. This schedule shift does not add any projects, but reorders them based on build time and need to replace radios sooner than originally anticipated. More detail has been provided to the board by memorandum.

A proposal to order the water tender to replace Water Tender 93 will be presented to the board at their next regular meeting (order in 2024 for delivery in 2026).

Programs and Projects

Fire Chief Recruitment: Chief Hartin has begun working with Chief Black to facilitate an effective transfer of command in mid-January. Proposed revisions to Chief Black's employment agreement and a proposed two-month employment agreement between the district and Chief Hartin have been transmitted to the board for their consideration.

A resolution amending the district's 2024 operating budget and authorizing transfer of funds from the general fund to the capital projects fund and leave accrual fund.

WHEREAS, East County Fire and Rescue Board of Fire Commissioners endeavors to be fiscally responsible, operate with transparency, and ensure adequate and sustainable funding; and

WHEREAS, the board of fire commissioners has adopted the 2024 district budget in accordance with RCW 52.16.030; and

WHEREAS, each of the district's funds is a separate fiscal entity and is established to conduct specific activities and attain objectives in accordance with statutes, laws, regulations, and restrictions or for specific purposes; and

WHEREAS; the board of fire commissioners established the capital projects fund and leave accrual fund to save money for anticipated future expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the 2024 comprehensive district's budget identified the need to transfer \$493,989 from the general fund to the capital project fund, and

WHEREAS, Project capital projects expense is projected to be higher than originally estimated, the transfer of funds from the general fund to the capital projects fund should be increased by \$15,678.

WHEREAS, the 2024 comprehensive district's budget identified the need to transfer \$10,000 from the general fund to the leave accrual fund, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Fire Commissioners amend the district's 2024 operating budget by increasing the budgeted \$493,985 transfer from the general fund to the capital projects fund by \$15,678 and that \$509,663 be transferred from the general fund to the capital projects fund; and

That \$10,000 be transferred from the general fund to the leave accrual fund as specified in the district's comprehensive budget.

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Resolution #361-12032024

A resolution revising the district's capital projects schedule, amendment of the 2025 capital budget and authorizing purchase of portable and mobile radios to replace radio equipment currently in-service, but at its end of service life.

WHEREAS, the district's portable and mobile radio equipment purchased in 2014 or earlier will no longer be supported by the manufacturer and cannot be repaired if broken; and

WHEREAS, the Clark Regional Emergency Service Agency (CRESA) which provides 911 dispatch and radio maintenance services for the district has initiated a group purchase to replace aging radios on a county wide basis; and

WHEREAS, the CRESA group purchase will save the district approximately \$76,252 over the projected single agency purchase price in 2027; and

WHEREAS, the district's current capital projects schedule programmed radio replacement for 2027; and

WHEREAS; extended fire apparatus delivery times has delayed delivery of the type one engine purchase authorized by Resolution 338-12192023 until 2026; and

WHEREAS, the purchase price for a water tender to replace Water Tender 93 has been quoted as \$700,700 (inclusive of sales tax); and

WHEREAS; The funds in the capital projects fund are identified as committed and can only be expended by resolution of the board of fire commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Fire Commissioners approve the following revisions to the district's capital projects plan and 2025 capital project budget:

- 1. Move the purchase of portable and mobile radio equipment from 2027 to 2025 and authorize purchase order 2024-0010-20 in the amount of \$258,971.73 for purchase of portable and mobile radios as specified in the purchase order and attached documentation.
- 2. Reprogram payment on the type one engine from 2025 to split this expense to a progress payment upon delivery of the chassis in 2025 and final payment for the type one engine to 2026.
- 3. Amend the planned expense for purchase of a replacement water tender in 2026 from \$550,000 to \$700,700 based on the quotation received from Rosenbauer America.

Subject: Radio Replacement Project

The district's capital projects schedule (as included in the 2025 adopted district budget) programmed replacement of the district's 800 MHz mobile and portable radios for 2027 with an estimated cost of \$335,223.

In October of this year we received the following communication from CRESA regarding the district's inventory of 800 MHz radios.

As you may know radios purchased with the P25 radio system in 2014 are now out of support and may no longer be repairable. CRESA is working with Motorola to obtain a discount off of NASPO pricing, but this would be dependent on a group purchase done by the end of 2024.

Many of you expressed interest in ordering as a group to see if we are able to get a larger discount. CRESA is exploring the possibility of making a single large purchase on behalf of our user agencies and invoicing your individual agency in 2025 after your order is received. Payment terms will be NET 30; there is no lease option. Please let us know if you are interested in pursuing this group purchase.

CRESA showed an inventory of 25 mobile radios and 27 portable radios, total of 52 radios (far in excess of the district's current in-service radios) as radios removed from service had not been removed from inventory with CRESA, Reducing the radio inventory to the requirements identified in Table 1 will reduce the fee that CRESA charges the district for radios on the system by \$7,700. Of the 47 radios listed in the inventory, 41 are currently out of support and cannot be repaired if they become inoperative. Support will end for the remaining eleven radios in 2025 (at which point they may not be able to be repaired).

Captain John Prasch reviewed the districts radio communications needs and identified the following requirements:

The radios specified in Table 1 would reduce the district's inventory by 11 radios, but would improve communications capability with all apparatus mobile radios and one portable per apparatus being able to communicate not only on the 800 MHz system, but also on UHF (Skamania County) and VHF (DNR) radio frequencies. Table 2 illustrates required distribution of mobile and portable radios on district apparatus.

CRESA pursued a joint purchase option inclusive of all fire and law enforcement agencies in the county that indicated an interest in a joint purchase. The expense for joint purchase of the mobile and portable radios identified in Table 1 is \$258,971.73 (inclusive of tax). Reprogramming the radio purchase from 2027 to 2025 and taking advantage of this county wide group purchase options will result in a reduction of projected expense (as specified in the capital projects schedule) of \$76,252.

The district's capital projects schedule should be revised to reflect:

- Delayed delivery time of the new engine purchased to replace Engine 94, delivery now anticipated in 2026 (rather than 2025) with a chassis progress payment in 2025.
- Increased expense to replace Water Tender 93 in2026 (if ordered by the end of 2024).
- Movement of the radio replacement project from 2027 to 2025 based on end of service of the district's current radio inventory.

This joint purchase option requires approval for purchase be provided to CRESA no later than Monday, December 9, 2024.
