East County Fire and Rescue Regular Board Meeting April 4, 2017, 7 pm Fire Chief's Report

- This past week members of the fire district staff, as well as board members, met with representatives of Emergency Services Consulting International (ESCI). Their team was conducting a site visit as part of their evaluation of the emergency services provided by CWFD and ECFR staff. By all accounts the visit and one-on-one interviews went well. It is expected that ESCI will complete their final analysis before June of this year.
- We have received written confirmation from CRESA that we have paid our radio replacement bill in full. We will of course keep this on record at Station 91.
- I had a follow up conversation with Grove Field consultant Damon Webster via e-mail following the last Board meeting. Mr. Webster stated that we had apparently gotten our wires crossed when we first spoke about this fire hydrant topic as he had always known from the beginning that the Camas Water Department would need to be integrally involved in the proposed project. Regardless, this should not change anything from the Board's perspective. Mr. Webster understands he'll have to work closely with the City of Camas on the proposed project to make sure all the proper permits are handled, should the Board ultimately provide authorization.
- Since the Board's last meeting, I have received notification from the Center for Public Safety Excellence that the renewal of my Chief Fire Officer (CFO) designation had been approved at their March 21 meeting. This renewal will maintain my designation for another three years.

Port of Camas/Washougal and East County Fire & Rescue

Agreement for Connection and Shared Maintenance For a Fire Protection Water System

Background / Existing Condition:

The Port of Camas / Washougal (Port) owns and operates the Grove Field airport. The airport has a fire protection system consisting of an onsite well, underground water storage tanks, pump, and related controls which supply water to nine hydrants and sprinkler systems within two hangers. The storage tanks have developed leaks and the shallow well is susceptible to seasonal fluctuations in groundwater, thus the system has become somewhat unreliable. This became a critical issue during a hanger fire two years ago. After analyzing options for renovating the existing fire protection system, the Port has determined the best option is to abandon the well fed supply and connect the fire protection system to a more reliable public water supply operated by the City of Camas. The City of Camas has a 12" water main in NE 267th Avenue (SR 500). This main currently supplies a small domestic water line to the airport and also the domestic and fire protection flows to East County Fire and Rescue (ECFR) Station 91. The 8" diameter fire protection main that serves Station 91 is owned and maintained by ECFR and runs from connection point in the southeast corner of the site, west around the station, and then north to a terminus with a fire hydrant just beyond the concrete / asphalt transition on the backside of the station.

Proposed Action

The Port wishes to enter into an agreement with ECFR to allow connection to the ECFR fire protection main at the terminus described above. The Port proposes the following conditions and to provide these elements as part of this agreement;

- Perform the work necessary to prepare engineered plans for connection to the ECFR water line at the location described above.
 - Plan based on current topographic survey and record information.
 - Plan prepared to meet City of Camas utility plan review standards and Clark County engineering plan review standards.
 - Plan will minimize and mitigate all impacts to ECFR fire protection main function and vehicle access during construction.
 - Asphalt pavement removed to make the water main connection will be neatline saw cut and replaced to "in-kind" or better condition.
- Submit a 50% design to ECFR for review.
 - Address comments

- Submit 100% plan to City of Camas and Clark County for review.
- Prepare bid documents
- Conduct a public bidding process for selecting a contractor.
- Provide construction administration and project management.
- Prepare a legal description of the shared fire protection line as a basis for an easement to the Port over the ECFR Station 91 parcel.
- Provide ECFR an "As-Built" plan of the modified fire protection line within the Station
 91 parcel boundary.
- Perform routine maintenance and annual testing of the shared fire protection line and hydrants.

The Port will also perform other work onsite at the airport to abandon elements of the existing fire protection system that will be made obsolete with the new supply connection. These efforts will not impact ECFR but are key to ensuring the correct operation of the airport fire protection system and avoiding potential false alarms or other malfunctions in the future.
