
Response Activity


During both February and March of 2024, East County Fire and Rescue experienced an unusually low number of incident responses. This is good news for the residents of our district, but staff have not yet been able to identify causal factors impacting frequency of incidents during this time period.

Staffing and Deployment

On Thursday, September 14, 2023, Engine, Water Tender, and Squad 94 were relocated to Station 93 for the duration of mold remediation and restoration at Station 94. Due to multiple complications in the remediation process and subsequent water leaks due to broken pipes during severely cold weather early in 2024 relocation lasted just short of six months. On March 1, 2024, Engine, Tender, and Squad 94 were returned to Station 94.




Figure 3. 90th Percentile Shift Staffing and Station 94/93 Availability for Response

During the month of March, the district maintained a 90th percentile¹ shift staffing level of 3 personnel during the day (07:00-19:00) and 3 personnel at night (19:00-07:00). Station 94 was unstaffed 6 times for a full shift (07:00-07:00), twice during the day and once at night during the month to date and as such, the availability of response from this station was 72.58%. Daily shift staffing is illustrated in Figure 2 and Figure 3 illustrates 90th percentile staffing and availability from Station 94.

During the month of March, three incidents were impacted by lack of staffing at Station 94 as illustrated in Table 2. All three of these incidents were high-acuity, priority two responses (which was handled with an extended response time by Camas Washougal Fire Department Engine 43).

Shift Reports

A Shift/Training: Training this month included EMS ongoing training and evaluation focused on anatomy and physiology, vehicle stabilization and extrication, fire control using a quick hit from the exterior and quick transition to the interior, and tactical ventilation. In addition, members completed four tactical decision simulations for the initial incident commander and one for the first arriving command officer.

Captain Burch completed preparation for live fire training using an acquired structure (house scheduled for demolition). This type of training is extremely valuable, but requires a great deal of planning and logistical support. The training was conducted on March 30th with the assistance of Skamania County Fire District 4 who provided an engine and water tender and Camas Washougal Fire Department who provided an engine and battalion chief.

B Shift/Facilities and Community Risk Reduction: Captain Sorensen has been busy with a large number of facilities maintenance projects including repair of lighting and other electrical issues at Stations 91, 93, and 94. Recent heavy rain uncovered the need for replacement of the gutters on the north side of Station 91 as they are leaking due to significant corrosion.

Captain Sorensen assisted in development of the district's Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant application and Fire Prevention and Safety (FP&S) Grant application.

C Shift/Apparatus and Equipment: Over the past month the district has been working on annual apparatus inspections consistent with National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1911 Standard for the Inspection, Maintenance, Testing, and Retirement of In-Service Emergency Vehicles. Water Tender 93 (formerly 95) and Engine 93 (formerly 95) have completed their annual inspections and related maintenance and repair. Significant expenses related to these two inspections were replacement of tires that were past their useful life and replacement of the priming pump on Engine 93 with an air primer as the existing primer had excessive wear. Over the first three months of the year we have replaced the rotary priming pumps on all of the district's engines with air primers (which have fewer moving parts, require less maintenance and are more reliable).

Captain Prasch assisted in development of the district's Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant application.

Programs and Projects

Grants: There has been a delay in the review of the Department of Ecology Hazmat Grant Applications due to a pipeline spill in Conway, Washington that occurred on December 10, 2023. Determination of award for this \$31,202 for non-fluorinated foam and related equipment is anticipated on April 2, 2024.

A \$303,867 Assistance to Firefighter Grant application has been submitted to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). This grant would fund replacement of personal protective equipment that is past its usable life (10-years), replacement of large diameter hose that is well past its recommended life span (10-years), purchase of large diameter hard suction hose and related strainers, hose appliances, a portable tank for Water Tender 93, and three decision-making thermal imaging cameras. All of these items were identified as high priority for funding in the notice of funding opportunity. Grant applications closed on March 8, 2024 and we anticipate hearing if we were successful sometime after August.

A \$1,245,446 Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant application has been submitted to the DHS, FEMA. This grant would fund four full-time firefighter positions for a period of three years (with no match requirement). If this grant is received and the proposed lid lift passes, the district would be able to address other currently unfunded needs (e.g., full funding of the capital projects fund or other financial needs).

The district will be submitting a \$30,000 Fire Prevention and Safety Grant application to DHS, FEMA for development of a community risk assessment and community risk reduction plan, a key component of the district's integrated comprehensive planning process and precursor to revision of the district's standard of coverage. The district initially intended to apply for a grant to support the district's smoke and carbon monoxide alarm program, but application for community risk assessment precludes any additional projects. Captain Sorensen and Chief Hartin will be exploring the option of crowd funding to

support this program (Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue had success with this funding mechanism for a Lucas Chest Compression System).

Depending on workload and time remaining until the close of grant applications on April 11, 2024 the district may also submit a SAFER grant application (amount yet to be determined) for volunteer recruitment and retention. There is a significant amount of work to be done to develop this grant request and we may not be able to complete this work prior to the deadline. However, work completed would be a great starting point for a subsequent application in 2025.

Administrative Specialist Pam Jensen is the primary contact for all of the district's DHS, FEMA grants. Captain Prasch is the secondary contact for the SAFER grant(s) and Captain Sorensen is the secondary contact for the FP&S grant.

Public Communications & Education: The Camas Washougal Post Record published the state of the district guest column authored by Commissioners Martin and Seeds along with Chief Hartin.


A direct mail (postcard) distribution to our residents advertising a series of hands-only CPR and AED classes should have arrived (or will be arriving shortly) at residences within the community. This public education opportunity has also been promoted via the district's social media channels. In addition to advertising this important public education program, this mailing and social media posts have the side benefit of increasing our brand recognition in the community, answering the question: Who provides your fire and rescue service? Dates and locations for the hands-only CPR and AED classes are shown in Table 3.

Live Fire Training Prop: In 2023 Chief Hartin identified that the district's live fire training prop was in severe disrepair. Based on discussion with staff it was determined that the prop, purchased by the district in 2005 had received little to no maintenance and had been out of service for at least three years.

Figure 4. Live Fire Training Prop





In discussion with Captain Prasch and Firefighter Grable we determined that it would be more cost effective to rebuild the prop rather than purchase a new one. Figure 4 illustrates the condition of the prop in early 2023.


Purchase of a plasma cutter and wire feed welder provided the most important tools necessary to rebuild the prop and support ongoing maintenance (as well as construction of additional props and other maintenance and repair activity).




Figure 5. Damage to the Live Fire Training Prop

The first step was to remove the damaged section of the roof and weld in replacement panels. This work was interrupted by winter weather, but has since been completed. The second step is to repair the floor, most of which had been damaged by corrosion of the metal flooring and thermal damage or rot of the wood sub-floor. All of the damaged flooring has been removed and work is underway to replace the wood underlayment with a 1" square steel tube grid with 11 gage metal deck covered with 2" concrete paving blocks. This type of floor system has proven to be durable under high use conditions. Figure 5 illustrates work completed to date.



GFOA Distinguished Budget Presentation Award Program: The district's 2024 Adopted Budget has been submitted to the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) Distinguished Budget Presentation Award Program.

Part-Time Firefighter Recruitment: The district made a conditional offer of part-time employment to Ben Mouser and he has completed all pre-hire requirements and was scheduled to start training and orientation on April 1st. Unfortunately, (for us but not for Ben), he was hired by North Whatcom Fire Authority as a full-time firefighter prior to his start date with ECFR.

The district made conditional offers of part-time employment to Krystal Harrison Moncier and Dalton Payne. If these two individuals successfully complete their pre-hire requirements, the district will be at full staffing for the first time since January 2023.

ESO Records Management System: We are closer, but still waiting on completion of the computer aided dispatch (CAD) system. Go live with ESO will occur as soon as this is completed.

Standard Operating Guidelines: A draft standard operating guideline (SOG) has been completed for cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) outreach. The purpose, scope, and policies for these SOGs have been submitted to the board for approval.

Work is ongoing in development of SOGs dealing with the district's revised step program, procurement and hazmat response to incidents involving fuel gases (natural gas and propane) and acetylene.

Levy Lid Lift: A request for volunteers to serve on the pro and con committees for the August 6, 2024 lid lift has been posted at Stations 91 and 94, on the district's web site, and social media channels (Facebook and Nextdoor). In addition, a press release on this request was sent to local media outlets. Citizens interested in participating, are asked to contact Fire Chief Ed Hartin at ehartin@ecfr.us or (360) 834-4908 by April 23, 2024.

Fire Commissioner Vacancy: Notice of the fire commissioner vacancy and request for qualified candidates to submit a letter of interest and answers to the supplemental questions by no later than April 12, 2024 at 5 pm. has been posted at Stations 91 and 94, on the district's web site, and social media channels (Facebook and Nextdoor). In addition, a press release on this request was sent to local media outlets.

Live Fire Training: ECFR along with an engine and battalion chief from Camas Washougal Fire Department and engine, water tender, and chiefs from Skamania County Fire District 4 participated in live fire training at 3211 NE 397th Place in Washougal (Bear Prairie). Training included fire behavior and fire control instruction for volunteer recruit firefighters and evolutions integrating incident command, fire control, primary search, and tactical anti-ventilation and ventilation along with use of water tender shuttle for water supply.

Purpose

Sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) is a condition in which the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating. If this happens, blood stops flowing to the brain and other vital organs. SCA usually causes death if it's not treated within minutes. The chance of survival drops by 10% each minute until the start of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). A five-minute delay in starting compressions can reduce chances of survival by at least 50%! Bystander CPR significantly increases the chance of survival.

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is used to help a person experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, but easy-to-use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. Public access AEDs are often available in businesses, schools, churches, and other public locations.

East County Fire and Rescue (ECFR) has implemented a CPR and AED outreach program to increase the percentage of people who live or work in the district that are trained and confident in performing hands-only CPR and using an AED.

Scope

This standard operating guideline applies to all members.

Policy

East County Fire and Rescue will deliver hands-only CPR and AED training for small groups at homes, community centers, businesses, or ECFR fire stations at no charge to the participants.
